

TRANSPORT OF PETS

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Apply online for an **import permit** obtained from the Philippine Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI) at <http://www.intercommerce.com.ph/baionetime.asp>
Processing time can take one to three working days.

2. Secure a **health certificate** for each pet from a duly licensed veterinarian or from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The health certificate should be dated within 30 days before the date of arrival in the Philippines. The health certificate should certify that the animal is free from, and has not been recently exposed to, any dangerous or communicable disease, and that it has been given anti-rabies and other required inoculations.
3. Submit the health certificate/s for authentication to the Philippine Consulate, either **in person** or **via registered mail**.
4. Processing fee is \$25.
5. Walk-in clients have a same-day release (3-4 hours) if complete requirements were submitted. For those applying through mail, processing time is one day plus delivery time depending the client's chosen courier and envelope.

If you would like to mail your application:

- Enclose a **self-addressed return envelope** with appropriate stamps for express or priority mail with tracking numbers via US Postal Service, or with pre-paid mailing envelope from private courier of choice.
- Enclose the **processing fee of \$25** (non-refundable) in postal money order, bank draft, or cashier's check. Checks should be made payable to "Consulate of the Philippines". Personal checks and credit cards are not accepted. **Do not enclose cash.**

Note: The Philippine Consulate General assumes no responsibility for any delay or loss in the mail, or while the documents are in the custody of the courier service. The applicant should note the tracking numbers of all envelopes used and submitted, and may track their envelopes at the USPS website: <https://tools.usps.com>

Requirements above (i.e., the import permit from BAI and authenticated health certificate) must be presented at the Philippine airport upon the arrival of the pet. Failure to present the requirements may result in pet/s being quarantined upon arrival.
